On Vicarious Suffering in This Passage

(Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Discipleship, 222)

Even though Jesus Christ has already accomplished all the vicarious suffering necessary for our redemption, his sufferings in this world are not finished yet. In his grace, he has left something unfinished in his suffering, which his church-community is to complete in this last period before his second coming. This suffering will benefit the body of Christ, the church.... What is clear... is that those suffering in the power of the body of Christ suffer in a vicariously representative action "for" the church community, "for" the body of Christ. They are permitted to bear what others are spared.
